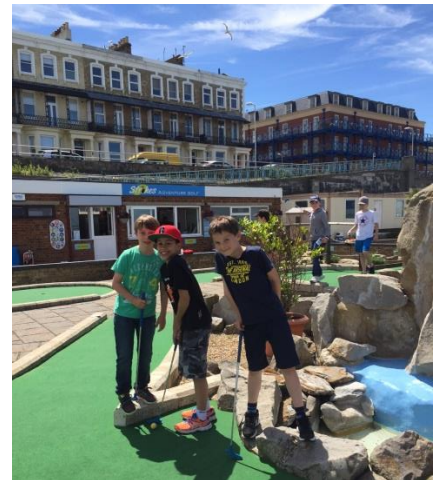
Winning House Trip to Margate

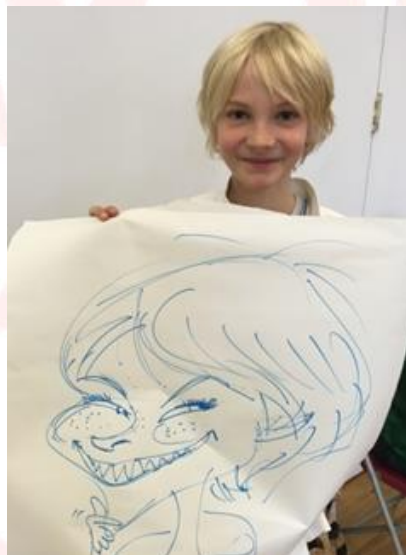
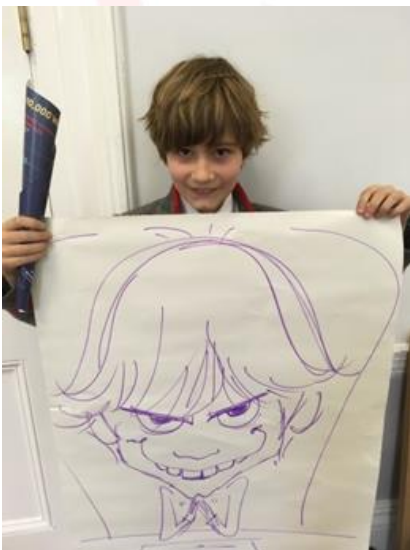

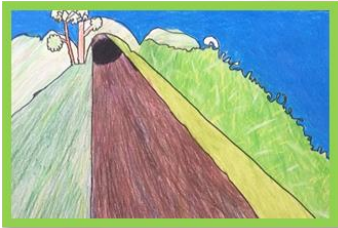


From the Art Department

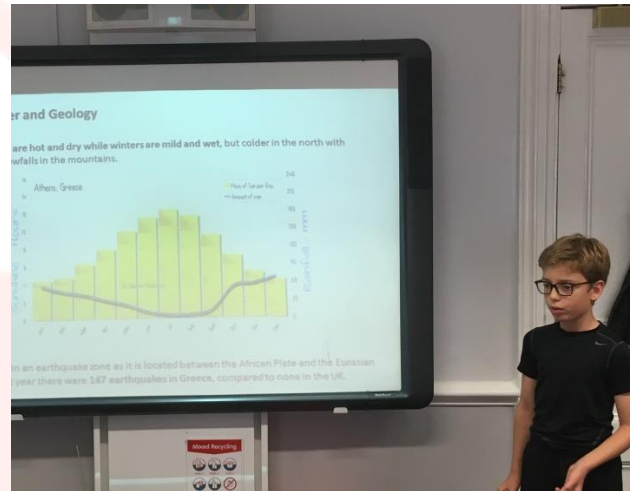
From the Geography Department – Year 5 Independent Research Projects

The swim team reflects the fastest swimmers in the school and trials are held every year so that the squad can be selected. Details of the two trial sessions can be found below.

Lower School: Years 3, 4 and 5 trials will be held at Seymour Leisure Centre, Seymour St, W1H 5TJ, from 4.30 to 5.30pm on Wednesday 13th September. Times will be taken in front, back and breaststroke. Please can you notify your form teacher and cc dean.bayes@wetherbyprep.co.uk to register your son for the trial when your son commences in September. The group will be walked across by staff at 4.10pm, leaving from the back door of the school and will be ready to be picked up from Seymour at 5.45pm, once the trials are completed. There will be no opportunity to take the late bus home. The trials are open to all comers. Parents of those boys who are selected for the squad will be notified by email. The Junior Squad train together on Wednesdays during term time from 4.15 – 5.00pm. Pick-ups take place from Seymour Leisure Centre at 5.10pm.

Upper School: Years 6, 7 and 8 trials will be held at Porchester Leisure Centre, Queensway, W2 5HS from 4.30 – 5.30pm on Thursday 14th September. Times will be taken in front, back, breast and fly. A Cracking Effort from Ms Kirby

Around 600 swimmers travelled to Dorney Lake on Saturday 24 June for the Eton Swim, an annual favourite in the south-east swimming community. Five challenges were available on the day ranging from a swift 750 metres to an epic 10km swimming marathon. After a record breaking June heatwave had hit the UK earlier in the week, swimmers and spectators would have been forgiven for packing their sunscreen, but were greeted on the day with an overcast sky and intermittent drizzle. The lake remained a pleasant 21.5°C, leaving some competitors debating until the last minute whether to wear a wetsuit or not. Ms Kirby, seasoned non-wetsuit open water swimmer, finished the 750m race in 16.57 in 11th place. Well done, Ms Kirby!



From the Performance Corner – Strength Training

Many aspects of health and performance benefit from Olympic style power lifting, commonly referred to as strength training, as the literature suggests. There is a misconception that lifting weights; such as barbells, squatting or dead lifting, adds unnecessary bulk and weight gain. In fact, research suggests power lifting supports many health outcomes. Consequently I suggest everyone should consider a weight lifting programme specific to age and health goals.

Functional training - Research has highlighted that power lifting strengthens legs, back and upper body musculature. Skeletal muscle can also be enhanced by power lifting. Improved muscle flexibility may also develop as a result of a strength training programme. The squat for example shapes and defines leg and hip muscles better than many other training modalities according to a recent study published in Medicine & Science in Sports & Exercise. The deadlift strengthens back and legs whilst the bench press enhances most of the major muscles in the upper body. Assistance muscles are fully engaged during whole body lifting exercises. This supports the concept that functional training, such as power lifting, potentially impacts the whole body and may improve several physiological markers as we age.

Fat loss - Power lifting is an explosive training modality with the potential to burn lots of calories. Long-term, this may affect metabolic output i.e. burning calories more efficiently. Research has shown that participants undergoing resistance training can increase calorific output over a 24 hour period by up to 15 percent. Resistance training can therefore be effective in a fat loss programme.

Skeletal health - Resistance training has the potential to decrease numerous health risk factors by improving ligament and tendon strength, bone density and mitochondrial function (energy metabolism). Applying force through the joints also facilitates osteoblast activity, the proliferation of new bone tissue. Weight training helps bones retain its calcium content and helps stimulate the formation of new bone. Weight training approximately three times per week for a minimum of ten minutes can stimulate these physiological changes. It's possible to lay down new muscle and bone density at any age, staggering!

Athletic ability - The act of power lifting improves other biomechanical markers including speed and vertical jump. A 2004 study published in the British Journal of Sports Medicine highlighted a correlation between squat strength and sprint speed. There was also a direct correlation between squat strength and vertical jump. Therefore, if you want to run faster or jump higher, consider building a bigger squat through power lifting. To conclude, whole body weight bearing exercises contributes to sporting excellence such as martial arts, rock climbing and running. It also adds value to everyday activities, from correct posture to breathing and improved sleep. Do drop me a line if you have any further questions on this topic.

Holding the shot

The shot is held at the base of the fingers not the palm

The fingers are slightly spread apart

The thumb supports the shot

The hand is bent back in a cocked position

It looks like you are carrying a tray

Neck placement

Raise the shot above your head

Lower the shot straight down under the jaw

Push the shot into your neck

Lift your elbow parallel to the floor. Don't squeeze your elbow towards your back

Check to see that your thumb is pointing down

The palm should be pointing towards the throwing area

Delivering the shot

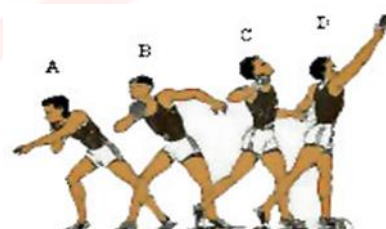
Eyes to the sky

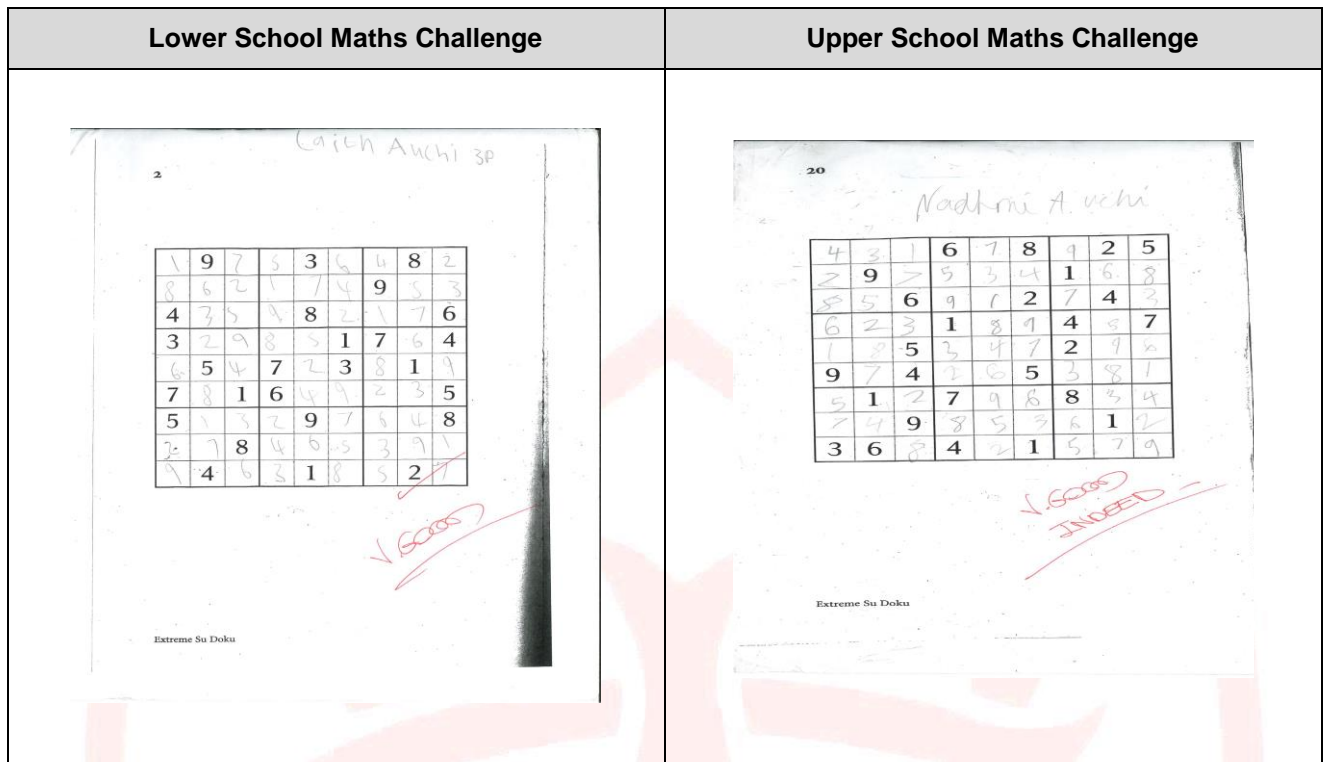

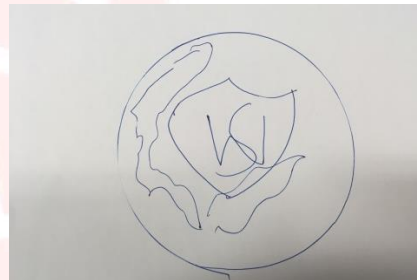

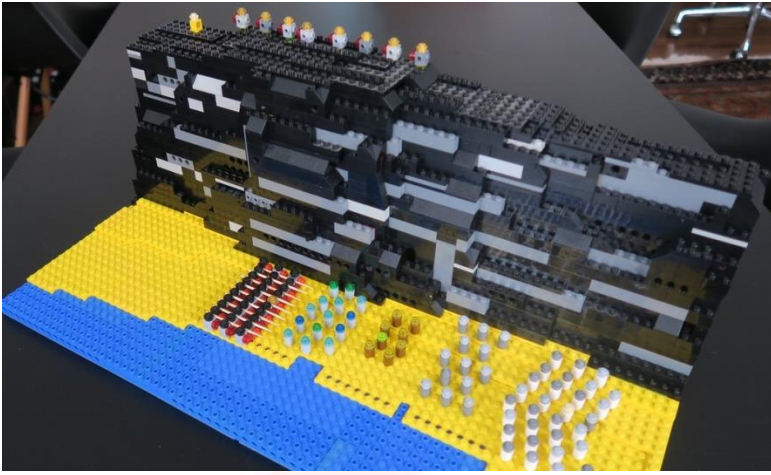
